
A Word from the Pastor

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan; Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago.

Many of us are familiar with these lyrics from a hymn usually sung at Christmastime. Rev. Joyce Borger, worship leader and hymnal editor, writes about hymns and hymnals as resources for pastoral care.* Hymns speak to us about the challenges we face. When we open the hymnal we want to hear God speaking to our needs and to speak to God in song.

Some hymns we sing are "heart songs," songs that we turn to over and over again, in joy or sorrow. These are the hymns we have memorized. Hymns speak not only to our particular situations, but also help us to think beyond ourselves to events in our nation or world. In the midst of human catastrophes like the pandemic, we need a way to enter into the grief left in its wake. We might choose a hymn like "Come, Bring Your Burdens to God" out of the African tradition, or "Abide with Me," a heart song many of us have committed to memory.



The voices of the bereft may be sore from grief, unable to sing, but we can sing on their behalf, holding on to the promise that "ills have no weight and tears no bitterness," even when they might not feel that reality. This kind of song helps us authentically acknowledge that we are part of a larger Christian community. When one part of the body suffers, we all suffer, and when one rejoices, we share in that rejoicing.

"In the Bleak Midwinter" was written to make the birth of Christ personal to each of us, as intimate as the ice, snow and wind that come into each of our lives. While things may seem bleak, life still beats beneath the snow. New ways of doing what we love are even now underway: with our new hymnal, we will sing both "heart songs" and newer hymns we will come to love. We can sing those hymns while in the sanctuary, to ourselves or when livestreaming our worship service. We can even sing as we collect food for the food ministry!

We are always making music in different and beautiful ways. Music helps us to let go of old things so the new can be born. This newsletter will give you a peak at what is new, so if you find yourself beset by the mid-winter blues, why not try one of them? Or even all of them?

It is in the bleak midwinter that we send and receive notes of affection to and from those we love, sure signs that this season of contemplation and growth contains seeds of hope. We can even sing of Spring, knowing it will surely come.


Minute for Mission: *White Gift 2021 Update*


VOICES IN MISSION!
