A Word from the Pastor: Word(s)

There was a time in our teenagers' lives when any question we asked was met with this reply: "Word."

This succinct response indicated they heard

whatever it was we were asking. Even if they chose not to answer the question at that moment!

The words we use to answer life's big questions often leave us figuratively (or really) scratching our heads. Even the word "word" can do that. We can misinterpret what someone is asking, or saying, if we fail to understand which "word" they mean. In our church lives, for instance, it is very possible to be confused about that word, "word." And that matters because we listen differently depending on which "word" is the subject of our inquiries.

In his excellent book "Streams of Living Water," which details the six traditions that define Christian faith and practice, Richard J. Foster helps us to understand what we mean when we refer to "the Word-centered life." The Word comes to in three forms: written, living and spoken. The written Word has, over centuries, been the focus of what we may and do read in



worship. Until the Bible was compiled, edited and published in a way that allowed common folk to own one, the written Word was interpreted for us by councils and priests.

When we were able to hold a Bible in our own hands and read it, interpretation became more an individual, private matter, depending less on communal understanding. This movement from common to solo understanding led to differing views on who the Living Word was (Jesus/Immanuel/Logos, Sophia) and how we should speak of that Word in proclamation and preaching, creeds, public prayer and social action. These differences gave the Presbyterians a good rationale for forming a committee to wrangle the Written, Living and Spoken Word to the ground!

All of this makes me glad that so many of you take the Word living, written and spoken into conversation following worship on Sunday. The practice of *communal reading* is one that welcomes all of us, no matter how or if we ever learned to read the Bible, into a gathering of folk who are trying to figure out what the Word means for their own, lived lives. Think of it as a "rehearsal space:" a place where no one ever needs to feel as if they don't know enough to talk about the Word of God but are eager to practice it with others.²

So: feel free to sign up for a Christian Life Group to dive into the Word by calling the church office at 215-357-8282. Or, if the Word is a thing you like to sing – or play – you can do that in Choir or by joining our Praise Band. Minute for Mission: Bethany Christian Services

Mental Health Month

A portion of mission funds support counseling and therapy scholarships to clients at Bethany Christian Services' office in Jenkintown. As the pandemic enters a second year, there has been a rise in the need for individual and family counseling. Of those who treat anxiety disorders, nearly three-quarters reported an increase in demand for treatment.

The mission of Bethany Christian Services to demonstrate the love and compassion of Jesus Christ by protecting children, empowering youth, and strengthening families – all are important for strong communities. Their core beliefs are simple: love God and love people.



Bethany wants to serve as many people as possible. Normal counseling sessions are between \$85 and \$100 per session. For some, this is too expensive to allow for regular counseling sessions, and their insurance is not in network. This is why the counseling/therapy scholarship was set up.

Mission funds are now assisting a sibling set of three – two teen brothers and an older sister. The goals of therapy are to help process past trauma (unknown birthparents and escape from country of origin) and learn healthy coping skills within depression and anxiety diagnoses, while transitioning to new foster homes.

There are lots of myths, misunderstandings and assumptions around mental health, which can lead to stigma (a feeling mental health is something to be ashamed of or hidden). As mental health allies, we can challenge stigma when we see it. We can also be supportive by actively listening, checking in with folks, getting educated (there's lots to learn about mental health) and validating what another is experiencing.

In addition to your donations, please pray that hearts and minds will be open to mental health services and that Bethany staff will have the opportunity to serve them well.
